The City of Cape Town requests access to your property to confirm breeding sites and to remove guttural toads

Dear Resident,

The Guttural Toad is an invasive toad species and poses a serious risk to the Endangered Western Leopard Toad.

Our role

The City of Cape Town in partnership with the South African National Biodiversity Institute (SANBI) and CapeNature are currently implementing a project to manage the invasive Guttural Toad which includes locating and removing them.

The toads have a distinguishing guttural call which enables the team to locate them. After tracking these toads over the past few months **we noticed that there may be a Guttural Toad breeding site on your property.** We would like to make an arrangement with you to allow access to our teams to confirm the breeding sites and to remove the Guttural Toads from your property.

Your role

This is an opportunity for you to assist us in our efforts to ensure healthy ecosystems and conserve our natural heritage for generations to come. The NCC Environmental Services has been appointed by the City of Cape Town to implement the Guttural Toad control project. **Please contact NCC Environmental Services to discuss suitable arrangements regarding access to your property.**
